Ancram Hamlet: 82/7 Intersection... we're Sculpting for Safety

The program to improve this dangerous intersection (see below) is on its way with Phase One!



The State's right-of-way will be "shaved" back on the NE corner to improve sight lines down Rte 82 from Rte 7, as simulated in the photo below. The retaining wall between the Tinsmith House and Porter's Store will also be stabilized.



Ancram's Intersection Committee and County Commissioner Dave Robinson defined this as the first phase. Having County and State approvals means the work can begin early in the spring. Once started, the project will be completed in a week or so.

The next phase will address the sight line up Route 82 from the NW corner.

One of five Fire District Commissioners is elected every December for a 5-year term. On Dec 11, John Ingram, also Planning Board Chair, was elected 44 to 2, replacing Perry Miller.

On the 18th, the Fire District's referendum for a \$895,000 bond to build an extension to the firehouse (pictured above) was approved 106 to 18. This will be a fitting home for the new fire truck, purchased last summer.
