Ancram Seniors Contribute to Our Community

On Tuesday, May 24, Nancy Bryant went to Albany where she was honored as one of three outstanding senior volunteers in Columbia County. Among the activities for which she was recognized are organizing, collecting, packing, and distributing turkeys and fixings for families in Ancram (and neighboring towns) who wouldn't otherwise have a real holiday dinner at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Nancy is likely to be the driving force behind any assistance a neighbor receives. Often, the help she delivers is done quietly, without most people even being aware of it. Also, our town's Communication Committee has put her fine proofreading skills to use time and again, and she edited the local cookbook produced by Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

Ancram can be proud of all the seniors who live here and help to make Ancram a better place. Our town nominated four people for the honor of senior citizen of the year. Let's see if we can make it two in a row.

Next year, we'll again submit the names of Prope Dietter, Woody Hoyt, and George Wittlinger. They are among the many, many senior volunteers who consistently offer their services to the townspeople of Ancram.

Here's an example. When playground construction had to be postponed to mid-week, who was available when most of the younger people were all at work? Yes, a group of ambitious seniors led by George Wittlinger, who never sat down. He was there everyday, working and advising, so we now have an outstanding playground for Ancram.

Town Receives State Grant for Ancramdale Voting Ramp

The town applied for a grant for \$5,817 from New York State to pay for the installation last year of a handicapped ramp at the Ancramdale polling place, which is the Ancramdale Presbyterian Church. The grant was recently approved, so the town has received back the \$2,500 that the town had contributed, and has given the Church the \$1,100 it contributed, and returned the balance of \$2,217 to Neighbors Helping Neighbors.

Remembering Our Veterans

[The following is an excerpt of Art Bassin's comments after the Ancram Memorial Day Parade.]

155 Ancram men and women have fought in America's Wars – 45 fought in the Civil War; one fought in the Spanish American War; 33 fought in WW I; 68 fought in WW II; 17 in the Korean War, 44 were in Viet Nam; 11 served in Lebanon, Grenada, and the Middle East, and four currently serve. Two died in action in WWII.

We are here today at Blass Memorial Park, named in honor of Sergeant Wallace T. Blass, who was born in Ancram in 1913, and killed on the island of Luzon, in the Philippines in April 1945, while serving with the 25th Infantry Division artillery. Stewart Mortinson, an Ancram resident when he went off to fight in WW II, was killed in Romania.

If you look at the war memorial monuments in Ancram and Ancramdale, the same names keep coming up: Belcher, Blass, Boice, Boyles, Brandt, Brothers, Bryant, Card, Coons, Decker, Dietter, Kilmer, Hoysradt, Hoyt, MacArthur, Mackay, McHugh, Miller, Near, Parsons, Porter, Proper, Rockefeller, Shook, Sigler, Sommerhoff, Stickles, and dozens more.

Today Americans are fighting in Iraq, Afghanistan, Libya, and around the world in the war against terrorism. Four Ancram men are currently serving, fighting in these wars. PFC Eddie Boyles is an Army medic in Afghanistan. SSgt John MacKay has served in the Army almost 13 years, with three of those years in harm's way in Kuwait, Iraq, Afghanistan and South Korea. USMC Major Kurt Sommerhoff joined the Marine Corps right out of college, and recently volunteered to rejoin the Marine Corps a few years ago. And Dan Hoysradt is in the Army National Guard, on call at any time for active duty if the need arrives.

Throughout our national history, we have been fortunate that every generation has been willing to step up, answer the call, serve in our military and make the ultimate sacrifice for the nation. So today we remember, honor and celebrate those who have served and died in the nation's wars. We pay our respects and acknowledge our debt of gratitude to fallen comrades.

Please join me for a moment of silent prayer.

God bless the men and women serving in our armed forces, and may God bless America.



Columbia Land Conservancy Celebrates 25 Years


